**K12-Scalable SaaS Platforms** strike the right balance. They're designed for education, include compliance features, and integrate with SIS, HR, and Finance systems. They can start small and expand over time, making them a sustainable choice.

**Generic Enterprise Platforms** may look appealing due to their robust features, but they're often too complex and costly for K12. They require heavy customization and ongoing IT support, which most districts cannot sustain.

### Step 2: Choose Your Champion

- ✓ Reliable integration with other systems to ensure data integrity and consistency
- ✓ Robust data security to protect confidential records

#### Strategic goals:

- ✓ Reduce manual staff work and remove the burden of paper
- ✓ Improve equity and accessibility in digital interactions with families
- ✓ Enable scalability to digitize other processes without new technology investments

By distinguishing must-haves from strategic goals, districts can evaluate vendors against both immediate needs and long-term results.

*Pro Tip:* If you map current workflows and measure problematic bottlenecks, you gain a baseline to measure ROI once digital transformation is in place. Those numbers will look *great* on your resume.

- ✓ Can you demonstrate a complete travel expense approval workflow?
- ✓ Can you demonstrate how to build a form?
- ✓ Show us a parent registration form on a mobile device, in Spanish.
- ✓ How do you ensure FERPA, HIPAA, or CJIS compliance?
- ✓ What training and post-go-live support do you provide?
- ✓ How do you support ADA accessibility requirements?
- ✓ How did other districts and schools solve these problems?

These questions force vendors to demonstrate value where it matters most: compliance, family experience, and district-wide workflows.

Pro Tip: Watch the vendor's behavior. Are they responsive? Transparent? Willing to tailor the demo? These cues reveal what the partnership will be like.

Vendors that understand K-12 bring more than technology — they bring proven strategies and a community of peers. Compliance support ensures the district stays audit-ready. Integration-first design prevents silos. Customer communities accelerate adoption. Ongoing support ensures districts never feel abandoned after go-live.
